NEW SECURITY MEASURES ARE NOW IN PLACE ON YOUR VISA DEBIT CARD

As your credit union, one of our most important jobs is to protect our members and their money. In our ongoing efforts to do just that, we wanted to take this opportunity to tell you about the newest layer of security we've recently put in place affecting your checking account and VISA debit card. Sadly, our little credit union is not immune to fraud and we have found a large majority of it originates from outside the United States. Therefore, we have blocked International transactions on your debit card. This doesn't mean you can't use your card outside the country, **you can**-you will have to notify us of your plans so we can adjust the rules for your account while you travel.

The Value of Trees to Our Community

- ◆ The net cooling effect of a young, healthy tree is equivalent to ten room-size air conditioners operating 20 hours a day.
- ◆ One acre of forest absorbs six tons of carbon dioxide and puts out four tons of oxygen.
- ◆ Planting of trees means improved water quality, resulting in less runoff and erosion. This allows more recharging of the ground water supply. Wooded areas help prevent the transport of sediment and chemicals into streams.
- ◆ There are about 60 to 200 million spaces along our city streets where trees could be planted. This translates to the potential to absorb 33 million more tons of CO₂ every year, and saving \$4 billion in energy costs.
